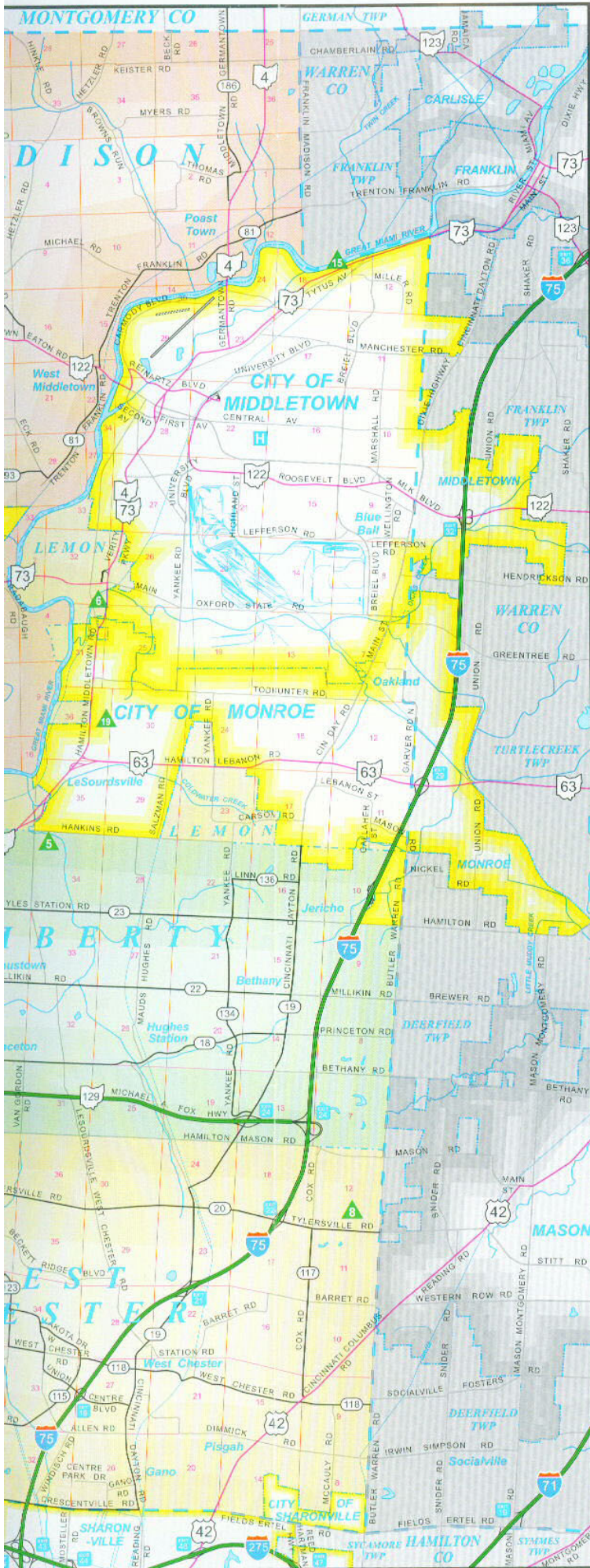

 KELLY TOWNSHIP - ENTER THROUGH PATER PARK WILDLIFE AREA
 1 ACRE (OPEN DAILY)
 BURIALS INCLUDE EARLY SETTLERS & VETERANS FROM REVOLUTIONARY WAR, WAR OF 1812, WAR WITH MEXICO, & CIVIL WAR.

 MADISON TOWNSHIP - 2070 WOODSDALE ROAD
 17 ACRES (OPEN SEASONALLY)
 1874 RESIDENCE OF SAMUEL AUGSBURGER FAMILY, LEADERS OF AMISH-MENNONITE SETTLEMENT LOCATED IN RIVER VALLEY BETWEEN WOODSDALE & TRENTON; BEING RESTORED AS PERIOD HOUSE MUSEUM / EDUCATIONAL FACILITY.
- 4 John C. & Elizabeth C. DAY FAMILY PARK**
 ROSS TOWNSHIP - 2420 LAYHIGH ROAD
 276 ACRES (CONSERVATION AREA NOT YET OPEN TO THE PUBLIC)
 BEQUATHED TO METROPARKS IN 2001 FROM THE ESTATE OF THE LATE MISS DOROTHY M. DAY IN HONOR OF HER PARENTS.
- 5 William F. & Cora DUDLEY WOODS**
 ST. CLAIR TOWNSHIP - 5591 HANKINS ROAD
 64 ACRES (OPEN DAILY)
 LEASED FROM LIBERTY TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES; SCENIC NATURAL AREA ALONG ONE-HALF MILE OF GREGORY CREEK, PICNIC SITES, TRAILS, HISTORIC GREGORY FAMILY LOG CABIN.
- 6 EXCELLO LOCKS**
 4 ACRES (OPEN DAILY)
 PERMITTED USE OF AREA BELONGING TO MIAMI CONSERVANCY DISTRICT, REMAINS OF FIRST LOCK ON MIAMI-ERIE CANAL, BUILT IN 1826.
- 7 FOREST RUN WILDLIFE PRESERVE**
 (FORMERLY LISTED AS FITTON WILDLIFE PRESERVE)
 ROSS TOWNSHIP - 1810 NEW LONDON ROAD
 82 ACRES (OPEN DAILY)
 NATURE SANCTUARY & WILDLIFE HABITAT AREA, NATURE TRAILS.
- 8 FREEDOM'S VOICE RESERVE**
 (METROPARKS PORTION OF FORMER VOICE OF AMERICA PROPERTY)
 WEST CHESTER TOWNSHIP - ENTER FROM COX ROAD
 200 ACRES (OPEN DAILY)
 PRESENT SITE FEATURES GRASSLAND WILDLIFE HABITAT WITH NATURE TRAILS, BUT DEVELOPMENT SCHEDULED FOR 2003 TO INCLUDE 30-ACRE RECREATIONAL LAKE FOR FISHING & BOATING, MULTIPURPOSE HARD SURFACE PATH AROUND LAKE FOR BICYCLISTS, WALKERS, JOGGERS, & SKATERS, PICNIC SITES, & NEW ENTRY FROM HAMILTON-MASON ROAD.
- 9 GILMORE PONDS INTERPRETIVE PRESERVE**
 CITY OF HAMILTON - 7950 GILMORE ROAD
 260 ACRES (OPEN DAILY)
 WETLAND & WILDLIFE HABITAT AREA, NATURE TRAILS.
- 10 GOVERNOR BEBB PRESERVE**
 MORGAN TOWNSHIP - 1979 BEBB PARK LANE
 264 ACRES (OPEN DAILY)
 PIONEER VILLAGE WITH 7 LOG HOUSES, INCLUDING BIRTHPLACE & BOYHOOD HOME OF WILLIAM BEBB, OHIO'S 16TH GOVERNOR, 1850 COVERED BRIDGE, PICNIC SITES, ONE RESERVABLE PICNIC SHELTER FOR GROUP USE, PLAYGROUNDS, 17 FAMILY CAMPSITES, OVERNIGHT YOUTH GROUP LODGE, & NATURE TRAILS.
- 11 GREEN HERON WETLAND**
 ROSS TOWNSHIP - 2161 NEW LONDON ROAD
 21 ACRES (CONSERVATION AREA NOT YET OPEN TO THE PUBLIC)
 NATURAL & WILDLIFE HABITAT AREA.
- 12 INDIAN CREEK PIONEER CHURCH & BURIAL GROUNDS**
 RELY TOWNSHIP - 300 INDIAN CREEK ROAD
 3 ACRES (OPEN SEASONALLY)
 INCLUDES 1829 BRICK CHURCH WITH 1810 CEMETERY SERVING AS FINAL RESTING PLACE FOR AREA'S EARLIEST SETTLERS.
- 13 INDIAN CREEK PRESERVE**
 RELY TOWNSHIP - ENTER FROM OXFORD-RELY ROAD OR SPRINGFIELD ROAD
 135 ACRES (OPEN DAILY)
 SCENIC NATURAL AREA, INCLUDING ABOUT ONE MILE OF INDIAN CREEK WITHIN PARK BOUNDRIES, & FEATURES GENERAL PICNIC SITES, ONE RESERVABLE PICNIC SHELTER FOR GROUP USE, PLAYGROUND, & NATURE TRAIL.
- 14 METROPARKS ADMINISTRATIVE HEADQUARTERS**
 ROSS TOWNSHIP - 2051 TIMBERMAN ROAD
 1.3 ACRES (OPEN WEEKDAYS DURING NORMAL BUSINESS HOURS)
 ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE LOCATED IN RESTORED EARLY 19TH CENTURY COUNTRY HOME.
- 15 MIAMI RIVER PRESERVE**
 CITY OF MIDDLETOWN - SR 73 BETWEEN MIDDLETOWN & FRANKLIN
 16 ACRES (OPEN DAILY)
 PERMITTED USE FROM OHIO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION; LIMITED PICNIC SITES, ACCESS TO GREAT MIAMI RIVER FOR FISHING.
- 16 MONUMENT CABIN**
 CITY OF HAMILTON - MONUMENT AVENUE IN HAMILTON NEXT TO SOLDIERS, SAILORS & PIONEERS MONUMENT
 CABIN ONLY (OPEN SAME HOURS AS MONUMENT)
 1804 LOG HOUSE RESTORED ON SITE OF OLD FORT HAMILTON.
- 17 PATER PARK WILDLIFE AREA**
 RELY TOWNSHIP - ENTER FROM MILVILLE-RELY ROAD OR GARNER ROAD
 34 ACRES (OPEN DAILY)
 LAND LEASED FROM OHIO DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES WHICH OWNS 192 ACRE PATER WILDLIFE AREA; NATURAL AREA WITH HUNTING PERMITTED IN SEASON.
- 18 RENTSCHLER FOREST PRESERVE & MIAMI-ERIE CANAL**
 FAIRFIELD TOWNSHIP, LIBERTY TOWNSHIP, LEMON TOWNSHIP & CITY OF MONROE - ENTER FROM 5701 REIGART ROAD
 ABOUT 360 ACRES (OPEN DAILY)
 SCENIC NATURAL AREA, REMNANTS OF MIAMI-ERIE CANAL, PICNIC SITES, TRAILS, PLAYGROUNDS, SOCCER FIELDS & FISHING ALONG RIVER BANK.
- 19 ROSEMONT FARM**
 CITY OF MONROE - 6388 HAMILTON-MIDDLETOWN ROAD
 13 ACRES (CONSERVATION AREA NOT YET OPEN TO THE PUBLIC)
 BEQUATHED TO METROPARKS IN 1997 FROM THE ESTATE OF THE LATE MRS. MARIE IRVIN.
- 20 SEBALD PARK**
 MADISON TOWNSHIP - 5580 EIK CREEK ROAD
 267 ACRES (OPEN DAILY)
 LEASED FROM THE CITY OF MIDDLETOWN; SCENIC NATURAL AREA, EIK CREEK RUNS THROUGH THE PARK, 11 RESERVABLE PICNIC SHELTERS, TRAILS, PLAYGROUNDS.
- 21 TIMOTHY PARK**
 CITY OF HAMILTON - 1277 SMITH ROAD
 60 ACRES (CONSERVATION AREA NOT YET OPEN TO THE PUBLIC)
 NATURAL AND WILDLIFE HABITAT AREA.
- 22 WOODSDALE REGIONAL PARK**
 MADISON TOWNSHIP - WOODSDALE ROAD ACROSS FROM CHRISHOLM HISTORIC FARMSTEAD
 ABOUT 84 ACRES (NOT YET OPEN TO THE PUBLIC)
 LEASED FROM THE BUTLER COUNTY COMMISSIONERS; TO BE DEVELOPED WITH TRAILS, OUTDOOR EDUCATION FEATURES & CANOE ACCESS TO GREAT MIAMI RIVER. ONCE DEVELOPED THE CHRISHOLM HISTORIC FARMSTEAD WILL BECOME THE HISTORIC COMPONENT OF THE OVERALL PARK.
